TWELVE BELLS AND MORE

Visitors to the Cathedral next weekend will find a "mini-ring" in the southwest porch. This is our Guild of Change Ringers newest instrument. This "mini-ring", known as 'The Smoke Ring', is used to help train bell ringers. There are no others in Canada and only one that we know of in the US. June 27 - 29, the Guild welcomes ringers from Philadelphia, Washington, New York, Charleston and the U.K., joining our own band. We will ring Friday afternoon from approximately 4:00 - 6:00pm, most of Saturday from 9:30am - 5:00pm or so, pausing for lunch and the 12:30pm Eucharist. We will ring Sunday morning, as usual, from 10:00 – 11:00am, then throughout the afternoon, depending how many ringers are still in town. Visitors to the bell tower are welcome on Saturday and Sunday afternoon, for as long as the tower door is open. The ringers thank the Cathedral clergy and community for their continued support. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. Romans 6:8

For me, even as a Christian, death is the end of my individual story... But in another sense, my death will not be the end of my story; because to be baptized is to be taken up into a larger and longer story, which is that of God's love for humanity, consummated in the death and resurrection of his Son, Jesus...
